14. Lighting Outage in the Yards 8:59pm
- a. Update from Gia Vocelli
 - i. They have mobile patrol down in The Yards
 - ii. N St between the two parcels under construction, issue identified and parts ordered, should be here May 8
 - iii. Lights on south side of N St affected by construction
 - iv. Lights out around Q parking lot (near District Winery) is likely due to a cut line at the corner of 4th and Water, solar lights arrived today
 - v. Next to Estate along 3rd St, these are on a Pepco line, but Pepco is telling Brookfield that they are not, they can't safely be fixed until power can be cut (will explore temporary solar solution)
 - vi. Retrofitting lights as they are fixed to prevent needing repeated fixes
 - vii. There are lights in two places: north of Tingey between 3rd and NJ, that are the responsibility of the historic building, and the second one near USDOT on NJ between Quander and M, these are private lights run by a panel inside the USDOT building
 - viii. DDOT is not upholding an agreement to fix the lights on streets they have taken over
 - ix. Michael Stevens: historic structure is now owned by Michael Goldman
 - x. Security personnel are conducting audits of lights twice a week
